

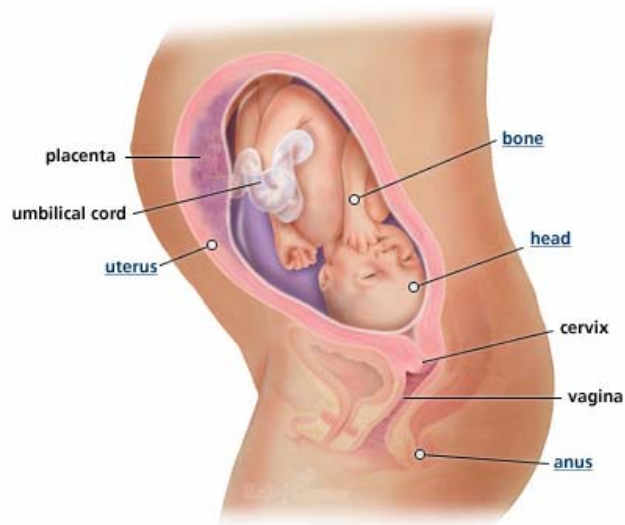
Our TTC Journey

Week 29 – May 30th – June 5th, 2008



Now that I'm officially into the 3rd Trimester, I have an overwhelming sense that the baby can come at any time now. DH and I decided to buy the travel system as we really don't know when I'll go into labor and if we get to bring the baby home, we'll need the car seat. I also started looking into what needs to be packed for the hospital stay.

Your baby now weighs about 2 1/2 pounds (like a butternut squash) and is a tad over 15 inches long from head to heel. His muscles and lungs are continuing to mature, and his head is growing bigger to make room for his developing brain. To meet his increasing nutritional demands, you'll need plenty of protein, vitamins C, folic acid, and iron. And because his bones are soaking up lots of calcium, be sure to drink your milk (or find another good source of calcium, such as cheese, yogurt, or enriched orange juice). This trimester, about 250 milligrams of calcium are deposited in your baby's hardening skeleton each day.



May 30 – I notice that I get very warm very easily, and almost everything I eat gives me heartburn. I have a craving for milk and watermelon. Bleh, but not together !!!

May 31 – I went to the movies with my sis and the baby wasn't very active during the movie, but woah, later that night, yes the baby was all over the place. I hope the baby's a night owl.

June 1 – Today we got the stroller and travel system. This is just in case the baby decides to come at any time, now we'll have the stroller and car seat to take him home. My shower invitations are also going to go out this week. I can't wait to see all of my friends again!

June 2 – The weather is warm again today. My job is thankfully not having me do much physical stuff, that is with the exception of driving 2.5 hours for a 1 hr meeting on a day when I've got a doctor appointment!!!

June 3 – I'm actually very sleepy today. I notice that at night I am starting to go to bed a lot earlier and sleep much more soundly than normal.
